## Conference site

Camp Hebron is a Christian retreat center located about 15 miles north of Harrisburg. Driving time is about 70 minutes from Shippensburg, 90 minutes from State College, and 2 hours from Philadelphia..

## Schedule

Our conference will begin on the evening of Friday, April 4 and conclude with lunch on Sunday, April 6.

## Cost

The registration fee of \$82 covers two nights of lodging and five meals (three on Saturday, two on Sunday). Children twelve years old and under are \$62. Make checks payable to University Bible Fellowship.

## When to arrive

The opening meeting will begin at 7:30 pm on Friday, April 4. Plan to arrive no later than 6:30 so that you will be able to participate in the opening meeting. Please note that **no dinner will be served on Friday evening**. Please plan ahead and make sure that you have eaten before arriving.

## Recreational activities

Camp Hebron offers supervised recreational activities including horseback riding and indoor rock wall climbing. No experience is necessary. These activities are optional, and their cost is not included in our registration fee. If you wish to participate in any of these activities, please bring an extra \$15 in cash to the conference.

## What to bring

Camp Hebron **does not provide linen**, so please bring a pillow, sheet, blanket (or sleeping bag, if you prefer) and a towel. Casual clothes are best. If you want to use the gymnasium and/or go horseback riding, please plan to dress accordingly. And don’t forget to bring a Bible, notebook and pen.



## Directions to Camp Hebron

**From State College and points west:** From 322-22, after crossing the Susquehanna River, take Rt. 147 North approximately 5 miles to the traffic light. Turn right onto Rt. 225 and follow 225 South 3/4 mile to Matamoras Road. Turn left onto Matamoras Road and follow 2.2 miles. The paved road soon veers right and becomes Taylor School Rd. - stay on Taylor School road until the stop sign. At stop sign, turn right, cross the bridge, go up a hill and the camp entrance is on the left.

**From Shippensburg, Philadelphia and points south and east:** Interstate 81 (Exit 67B), Rt. 322 West to 225 North Halifax Exit. Take Rt. 225 North through Dauphin and over Peter’s Mountain. At the bottom of the mountain after crossing Powell’s Creek, turn right onto Camp Hebron Road. Camp entrance is 3 miles ahead and on the right side of the road.

**When you arrive:** Follow the signs to Breezewood cabins. We will be sleeping in the Breezewood cabins and meeting in the nearby Breezewood Inn.
